


Areas of Special Character - see Policy HC2; areas shown in Purple




Areas of protected Open Space - see Policy EG4; areas shown in green




The Existing Development Envelope (black line) which includes the Conservation Area (brown line) – see Policy D1 and of general reference.

South parish

North parish

The main ridges follow roads or defined tracks.

To the north of the parish, a long ridge line runs from 'Peruppa Farm' in the north-west, along the road through Tregisky crossroads and continues along Old Road into and along School Hill as far as the property known as 'Moonfleet'. The full extent of this ridge line can be seen on the contour map on the previous page.

In the north of the parish a minor ridge line follows the track leading to 'Parc Franton', then takes a north-south line for a distance of some 250 meters, terminating roughly parallel with the southern end of Tregassik Plantation.

The other long ridge line runs largely roughly parallel with Tregony Hill partly along a track (marked as 410/3/2) from the edge of the developed area in the east to the property marked 'Trevailis' in the west. Tregoney Hill marks another ridge line from Summerfield Close (marking the end of the development area at that point) in the west as far as 'Polpier House' in the east. The full extent of these ridge lines can be seen on the contour map on the previous page.

In the south of the parish, a minor ridge line runs along field boundaries in a reverse 'Z' shape, beginning 200 meters north-west of 'Penwarne Manor' for a distance of 300 meters.
